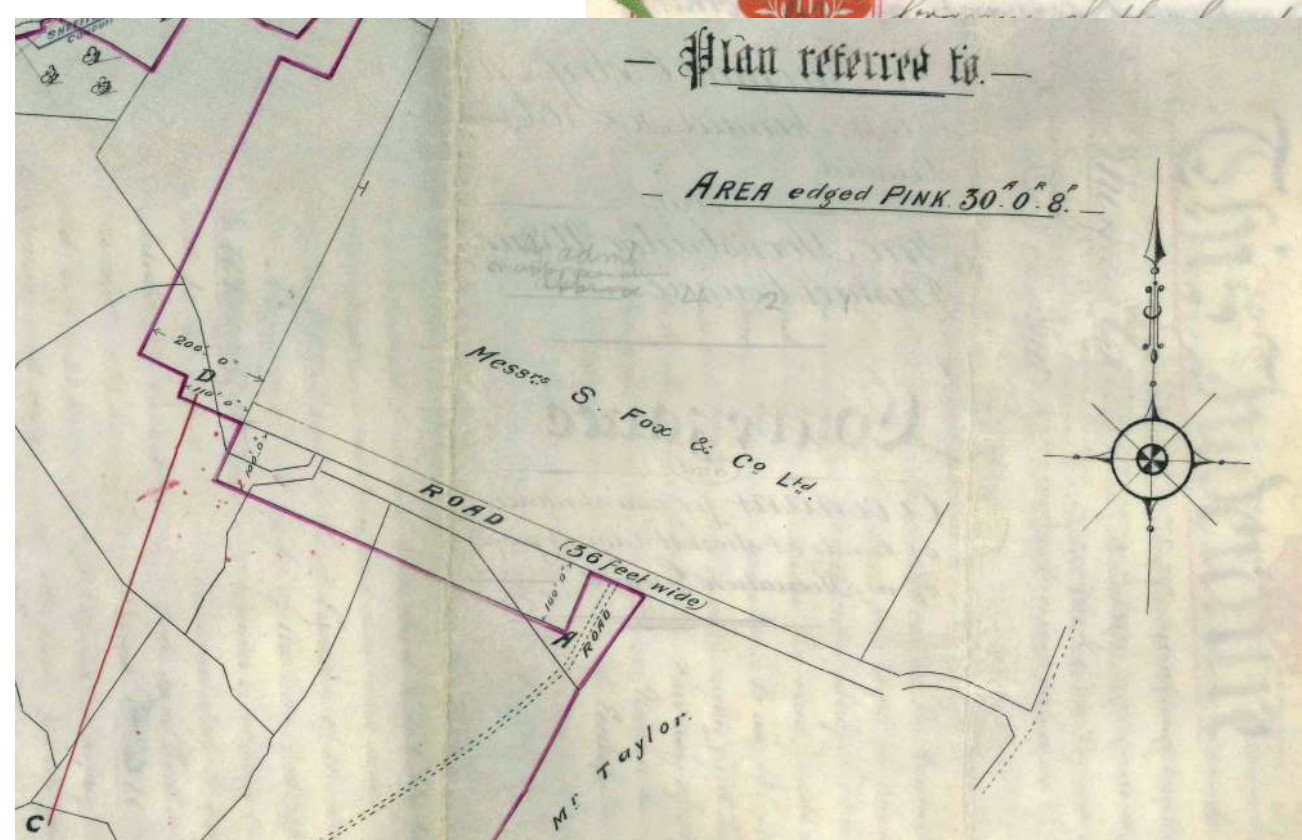
History of Oxley Park

Thomas (Jammy) Oxley donated the land, which now makes up Oxley Park, to the people of Stocksbridge in the 1920s, the monument shown in the photographs can be found next to the path at the top of the park.

The plaque is inscribed with the following words:

"These 34½ acres of land were presented by Mr Thomas Oxley to the inhabitants of Stocksbridge for the purpose of a Public Park or Recreation ground. The cost of laying out and the maintenance therefore being borne by Messrs. Samuel Fox & Co. Ltd"

Oxley Park has been a key part of the towns recreation and sporting activities for the last century.

100 years on from the park being donated to the people of Stocksbridge, Oxley Park has the opportunity for a major programme of investment and improvement through the Stocksbridge Towns Fund.

These improvements build on the phase 1 works completed last year which included upgrading the Stocksbridge Community Leisure Centre car park and access, better footpaths and a new play area in Oxley Park.

The next phase includes:

- An upgraded skatepark area with acoustic and landscape buffer
- A new 3G all weather pitch
- Upgraded footpaths
